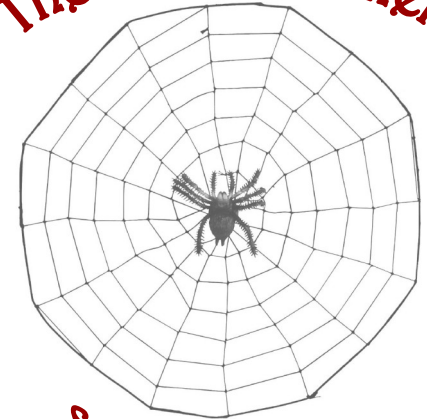

Reminiscing with Laura Ingalls Wilder

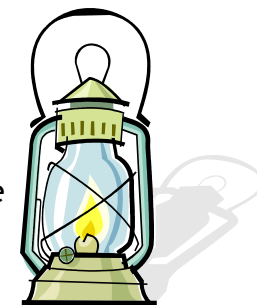
